Why ZERO WASTE Events

The climate in Washington State is changing as the planet is warming. Scientists have documented that increasing greenhouse gases in the atmosphere surrounding the earth are raising global temperatures.

The Cascades Mountains have lost 45% of their glaciers in the last 100 years.
